HOPE ELDERSHIP



Mark Henderson Chair of the Council of Elders Hope Presbyterian, not just Hope Church - why? Just as the term "hope" gives meaning and builds on one of the three great realities of the Christian life, so the term "Presbyterian" describes our form of church governance.

The Presbyterian Church is governed by a hierarchy of three courts or governing bodies which exercise their authority at a local, regional and national level.

The Church Council of Elders (all of whom are ordained as per the Book of Order) are made up of three groups of Site Elders (West Melton/Halkett, Rolleston, Hornby) and one group of Network Elders.

Network Elders have a focus on strategic issues that impact all sites, for example, supporting the senior pastor, driving and monitoring the overall direction, vision, mission and values of Hope Presbyterian including financial health. They also manage relationships with Presbytery, the national church, associated trusts and other external organisations.

Site Elders will be responsible for the governance of their site in the areas of pastoral oversight, upholding our values, pastoral care and ensuring the local delivery of the 5-year strategic plan and annual mission plan. Site Elders will also exercise discipline and monitor the local spiritual climate and look for local opportunities for mission.

The next governing body is Presbytery. Each parish is represented on the Presbytery by their minister and another elder. The Presbytery has responsibility for all the parishes and other ministries in its area. Its job is to coordinate mission, look after personnel matters and make sure parishes are functioning well.

Presbyteries are accountable to the General Assembly, the highest court at a national level. The General Assemby sets the policy and direction of the church as a whole, as well as approving the various regulations that help the church to operate as an effective organisation. The General Assembly normally meets once every two years.

The term "Presbyterian" relates to the Scottish reformation under John Knox which stressed the ministry of elders (presbyters) and church governance in which decisions could be made by representative assemblies rather than centralised bodies.

In the case of Hope, we delegate management of the church to Steve, our Interim Senior Pastor who will work with the Core Leadership Team (CLT) to execute the Strategic Plan for our church. A Mission Plan is produced each year by the Senior Pastor for the Church Council to examine and approve. At the end of the year, performance against proposed outcomes is reviewed. Part of the role of being an Elder also requires commitment to prayer, discerning God's will and pastoral connection to the congregation.



Mission comes from the heart of God. He is a God who loves all people and desires to have a vital relationship with them. God's Word makes it very clear that mission is not something new: God's purpose, as expressed to Abraham is that all the people of the earth would be blessed. We believe that God has called all his people to be involved in this task, but we recognise that each one has a different role that includes either going, or supporting those who go.

Hope Worldwide is the expression of how Hope Presbyterian Church believes God wants us to be involved in His plan to reach the unreached peoples of the world and be a blessing to them.

Each Hope church site has its own HWW Team. Their role is to keep their congregations in contact with the work in their country of focus. Also, to raise awareness of 'pressure points' around the world that we can pray into. The HWW team wants to be informative and inspirational in growing awareness of the unreached parts of the world, helping to grow in us a heart for the wider world. We facilitate events several times a year to inspire, inform and grow our faith, and catch a glimpse of God's heart for those who have never heard the Gospel.

There are many at Hope West Melton who have an interest in what God is doing around the world. Some of us have been involved in either short or long term Christian service abroad; others are part of the support networks here that enable others to go, including prayer, supporting friends working abroad, sponsorship, and many other ways.

You could be part of this by:

- · Joining with others who are interested in mission worldwide.
- · Choosing to receive regular news emails from any of these areas.
- Encouraging prayer for Worldwide mission in your Growth Groups.
- Attending occasional mission focus events, HWW Weekends, or occasional home meetings.
- Borrowing some of the missionary biographies from the HWM church library in the foyer.
- Joining our HWW Team, and helping us grow a strong DNA for mission in our church.
- Becoming a short term volunteer, or joining a small team to visit the workers we support.
- Growing your knowledge of how mission is changing and become part of meeting the challenges into the future.

WORLDWIDE CONNECTIONS

As Hope Church congregations have grown, each site supports overseas workers in a particular part of the globe. Part of our tithe goes to the work in these areas, we keep in touch, occasionally send teams to visit, and sometimes bring them to us. We become part of the work they are doing through communication, prayer and financial support.



Here at **Hope West Melton**, our focus is Mongolia, assisting the young Mongolian church to reach their own people. A Hope Hornby couple, Marlon and Julie Stufkins, began this work over 20 years ago. They are an inspiration as they have been involved with yearly visits to encourage and consult with the leaders of churches. Hope West Melton contribute to the Bible School training of the pastors of the Ger churches. Also, we support the Mongolian Mission Movement, which sends out workers to share the Gospel.



Hope Hornby focus on North India, supporting Prasanna and Arpana Khaling who manage the Sano Diyo girls home, and outreach into their community.

Hope Hornby also support their own workers, Andrew and Karen Stephens, who work in a closed access country in South East Asia running a language and vocational school.





Hope Rolleston focus on Tigi Verghis, who, after post graduate studies here at Lincoln Uni, returned to India and is now training Christian leaders in Servant Leadership.

Hope Rolleston also support Dr Simon and his wife Judy, and their four children who are in a leadership and medical role with OMF in Cambodia.





Who are we?

Te Whare Awhero translates to "The House of Hope" and our vision is to positively influence and strengthen our community. We do this by offering services that embrace families and individuals facing life's challenges to bring about transformation. We desire to bring about a sense of empowerment and tino rangatiratanga (selfdetermination for both self and community), through building on and maximising the strengths of those we interact with. We endeavour to enrich our community with manaakitanga - mutual and reciprocal hospitality, where people support and encourage one another. We are inspired by the example of Jesus, his compassion and his giving of himself to those who were marginalised by mainstream society. We desire to be the transforming hands and feet of Jesus, bringing messages of hope to the entire community.

How do we do this?

We offer affordable professional counselling services for anyone in need across the community. We provide a safe place for children to be before, after school and during the school holidays at subsidised cost through our OSCAR programme. We are active in our local schools, providing school support workers through the Mana Ake programme. We have school based counsellors and we work to welcome new residents to the Hornby community – supporting them to be linked into the local community with our new visitation support. Most importantly, each and every day, we continue to seek to find new ways to bring Hope to the Hornby community. We would love you to join us in this mission.
